Heart Transplant clinic welcomes new social worker, Michelle Lamont

We all know the vital role that social work can play during the transplant journey. We caught up with Michelle to find out a little more.


Can you tell us a bit about yourself?

I'm a social worker currently working at the Alfred Hospital. I've been working in social work for over 10 years and last year I returned to Melbourne and the Alfred hospital after working and living in London for three years. I moved back to Melbourne with my partner and our baby girl who is now one, she was born in England. Most of my social work career I have worked in various hospitals in Melbourne, London and Toronto.

When did you start working with the heart transplant team and what services do you provide?

I started working with the heart transplant team in September 2018. I am the social worker within the heart failure team, I work very closely with heart transplant patients and their families around a whole range of issues. As a social worker I aim to address the psychosocial impacts of illness in particular heart failure and hospitalisation for patients and their family. I complete a comprehensive psychosocial assessment, which looks at many aspects of your life.

Social work also provides emotional support to patients and families throughout the whole transplant process and support with discharge planning, crisis interventions, bereavement, grief and loss support, information and advice and referrals to many providers. The social work assessment is also part of the patient work up for transplant and focuses a lot on the carer and support required post-transplant.



What is your favourite part of the job?

I love supporting patients and their families through the transplant process ensuring they have all the support they need in hospital and after when they go home. It is a privilege to get to know each person's story and journey in life. The patients and their families have amazing stories to tell and have been through some very hard times. To be part of that journey is a privilege.

How can transplant recipients access your services?

The heart failure social worker will see both inpatients and outpatients. Patients can access my services by asking anyone in the heart failure / transplant team to make a referral to social work. Information and advice

can also be given over the phone to heart failure and transplant patients.

Dream holiday destination?

At the moment I would love to go to South America, in particular Argentina, as I'd love to visit the Iguaza falls (pictured above). I also love hiking so would love to do some walks in Chile and Peru. Food and the beach are also things I love, so relaxing on a beach and eating some amazing food in Brazil would be the perfect way to wind down after hiking.

Favourite food?

Chocolate, what more can I say? Least favourite food, this is a hard question as I really love food, the only thing I can think of now is honeydew melon the green melon.



NATASHA TRIPP

AND THE

HAIRLESS FOR AWARENESS FUNDRAISER

At the end of the 2018, HLTTV and our Second Chance Accommodation Program became a beneficiary of the Hairless for Awareness fundraiser held in Bendigo in memory of Natasha Tripp.

Natasha was a young woman with cystic fibrosis who showed extraordinary courage, strength and determination through three double lung transplants in the space of only 4 years between 2014 and 2017. Sadly, Natasha passed away in June 2018 in Bendigo aged only 25.

In October 2018, Natasha's stepmother Felicity, along with a few of her friends, shaved their heads (and one moustache!) in memory of Natasha to raise funds for the Bendigo Cystic Fibrosis Support Group.

The fundraiser aimed to provide much needed financial support to families impacted by cystic fibrosis in the Bendigo region. Through their incredible efforts, *Hairless for Awareness* raised over \$10,000.

Throughout her long transplant journey, Natasha, her partner and her family spent many nights in our Second Chance Accommodation rooms.

Because of this connection between Natasha and the Second Chance Accommodation Program, the Bendigo Cystic Fibrosis Support Group decided to make a \$5000 donation to the Program to ensure that other people with cystic fibrosis from Bendigo would be able to access subsidised accommodation post-transplant.

We are very honoured and grateful to receive these funds in memory of Natasha, and we are proud that the Accommodation Program was able to support Natasha and her family during what was an extremely difficult time in all their lives.

Sam's podium

It was a podium finish for Sam Ira at 2018 Australian Transplant Games

Sam Ira from the RCH Creative Studio has taken out two medals at the 2018 Australian Transplant Games.

Held every two years, the Transplant Games show the success of transplantation and raise awareness of organ and tissue donation.

More than 500 people competed in the 2018 Transplant Games on the Gold Coast, in sports such as volleyball, table tennis, cycling, athletics, road race, chess, scrabble, golf, swimming, lawn bowls, Petanque, darts and ten pin bowling.

Sam, who due to cystic fibrosis underwent a double lung transplant in 2009, and again in 2013, competed in darts and ten pin bowling, taking out a silver medal for the individual competition and a gold medal in the doubles, with his partner Thor.

Competing in the games was an opportunity Sam never thought he would get to be involved in.

"It took me more than five years to accept my condition and sign up for my first transplant, which I was in shock about and fortunate to receive after only seven weeks," he said.

"I underwent the second transplant four years later, when my lung function levels dropped dangerously low, and I was experiencing other health complications – it was really a devastating time for me."

Sam said it was a great feeling to be moving on in life and sharing his story.

"I used to bowl in a league before I had any transplants and got pretty sick, and I actually want to re-join a league and get back in to it. This is the first time I've been fit and healthy enough to be involved in the games and also the first time I could travel. "I went to Tasmania first and even went hiking and then to the Transplant Games on the Gold Coast – it was a fantastic experience to try out my new lungs especially on a plane.

"It was great to talk to other families and share our stories — I never used to talk about my health or my transplant — I'll definitely go back and I'm hoping to compete in other events."

Sam has worked at the RCH for more than 20 years, first a volunteer and then as a video producer and editor.

He is now preparing for an overseas trip, which he postponed due to his transplants, and focusing on other competitions, including the World Transplant Games in London later this year.

Relocation

Outpatient lung transplant clinic appointments are now on the 2nd Floor, Phillip Block

As most of our lung transplant members will now know, the relocation of the outpatient clinic is complete.

Outpatient lung transplant appointments are now on the 2nd Floor of the Phillip Block. To access the Phillip Block you just take the lifts directly opposite the front entrance of the hospital.

As well as a change of location, the team is working to improve patient flow through the clinics, so there will be some change to processes. Advice from the clinic is:

 Set appointments will be made from January to minimise waiting time. Patients – please arrive on time so clinicians can see you during the allotted time.

- Non-standard tests, such as MRI or echo, will be confirmed after clinic by phone or text message. This is to reduce congestion at Reception.
- If you are unwell, please let the clinic know before your appointment by calling the transplant nurses on 0417 046 210.
 They will then advise actions to take to ensure good infection control.
- Staff will request your mobile number and email address to improve follow-up communication
- There will also be changes to how clinic staff monitor your appointment progress – for more information, please ask your clinician.

What's your story?

Ventricular Assist Device (VAD) technology is becoming an increasingly important pathway for patients suffering from heart failure. In Australia, VADs are typically called a 'bridge to transplant' as they allow the patient time to stabilise and subsequently get a heart transplant.

The Alfred have performed dozens of VAD operations in the last twelve months with patients coming from Victoria, South Australia and Tasmania.

Becoming a VAD patient at The Alfred in September 2017 and currently waiting for a heart transplant, Graeme Klemm is compiling a booklet that details a variety of information and suggestions for patients who are either waiting for or have recently benefitted from VAD technology.

Top tips for transplant travel

A new year often means travel plans, and for many people travel is one of their post-transplant goals. Travelling post-transplant is not hard, but it does take a bit of planning... so here are our top transplant travel tips for 2019.

DOCUMENTS TO TRAVEL WITH

Whether you're travelling in Australia or overseas, carrying a letter from your transplant clinic with your medications, dosages, main diagnoses and details of Alfred contacts is a good idea. The letter can help if you get sick and need to access care away from your usual providers, and will also help you get through customs if you're carrying medications when travelling overseas. Make sure you leave pharmacy labels on medication bottles and packages as well to make it easier to get through customs if you are stopped.

RECIPROCAL HEALTH CARE AGREEMENTS

Some countries – including NZ and the UK – have reciprocal health care agreements with Australia. That means that if you get acutely unwell and can't travel home, you can get help with the cost of essential medical treatment. Reciprocal health agreements don't replace the need for travel insurance, but may make access to health services easier where the agreements exist.

TALK TO YOUR DOCTORS

Before you set anything in stone, have a chat to your transplant team about your particular needs, what you should consider, and whether some travel ideas might be off the table at the moment.

TRAVEL CLINIC

Did you know that The Alfred has a travel clinic? It is bulk billed, operates outside working hours, and are familiar with the ins and outs of travelling with transplant!

Just ask your transplant doctor for a referral before you head overseas.

CHECK RESTRICTIONS ON CARRYING MEDICATIONS OR LIQUIDS BEFORE YOU GO

The government Smart Traveller website www.smarttraveller.gov.au is invaluable for overseas travel. Other countries have different rules about bringing in medications – particularly pain medications – that you need to check and understand before you travel. It's also important you understand what can be taken on planes (liquids, syringes etc) and seek exemptions where these items are restricted if you need them while you're in the air.

TRAVEL INSURANCE

If you're headed overseas, it's sensible to travel with insurance that covers your transplant. This can increase the costs of your trip significantly, and can be difficult to get for some countries, or if you are particularly unwell, so be sure to factor the time and costs associated with getting insurance into your planning. The companies that will insure transplant recipients changes from time to time, but at HLTTV we tend to have a few travellers among our members and keep our ear to the ground about what's available. The Ballarat Transplant
Recipient Catch-Up Group
was formed in 2017. The
group provides recipients and
their carers the opportunity
to obtain information and
education from health
professionals in a relaxed and
informal group environment.

Equally important is the vital network and social support it allows the recipients and their carers to establish in their local area.

This is the only group of its type within Victoria, and is endorsed by the Heart Lung Transplant Trust of Victoria, affiliated with the Alfred Hospital.

Ballarat is a regional town in Western Victoria, around 120kms from Melbourne's CBD. Members of the group come from all around Ballarat and surrounding areas, as well as from other outer metropolitan centres such as Geelong and Melton.

The idea for the group was driven by recipients themselves, expressing the need for education and support closer to home. The ideas and themes for each catch-up is driven by the recipients and is organised and coordinated by a local nurse specialist.

Topics already covered included skin care, medication guidance and nutrition. Local experts volunteer their time to provide the education and advice is always sought from metropolitan transplant services when required.

Education and information is delivered in an informal local setting, easing the travel burden to recipients and their carers. The impact of widened support and networking opportunities is extremely valuable.

The group continues to expand its membership base providing quality education, support and socialisation for transplant recipients within the local community.
